What was the only Canadian film to win an Academy Award? The Barbarian Invasions (2003) directed by Denys Arcand, the first Canadian film to receive the Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film.

Who was the longest running Prime Minister?

William Lyon Mackenzie King 21 years 154 days (1921, 1926, 1930, 1935, 1948)

What is Canada's biggest export?

Crude Oil

What is Neil Young's hometown?

Omeme, ON

Who was the 1st Canadian to walk in space?

Chris Austin Hadfield (born August 29, 1959) is a Canadian retired astronaut, engineer, and former Royal Canadian Air Force fighter pilot. The first Canadian to walk in space, Hadfield has flown two Space Shuttle missions and served as commander of the International Space Station.

What was Canada's best finish at the Olympics (summer & winter)?

2010 Vancouver BC! Canada finished the 2010 Winter Olympics at the first place at the medal table, with 14 gold medals. Canada was the first nation to win 14 gold medals at a single Winter Games.

Whose face replaced Sir. John A MacDonald's on the Canadian \$10?

Viola Desmond (Canadian civil rights activist and businesswoman of Nova Scotian descent.)The \$10 bill featuring Desmond's face went into circulation in November 2018. It was the first banknote with a Canadian woman on it, and was named the banknote of the year by the International Bank Note Society.
